

BUDDHIST-HINDU PRIORITY

COUNTRY: MONGOLIA PROJECT: GOVI-ALTAI COMMUNITY CENTER

Our ministry team in Govi-Altai has a vision to work with and support local churches while reaching out to the community through relational evangelism and compassion ministries. We have a goal to establish a community center in the hub of our province that can serve 200 children and young people on a daily basis.

Govi-Altai is a small province in western Mongolia with less than 50 believers in the entire province. The province center has four small churches (less than 10 adults) and almost no preaching points in the surrounding villages. After being in this province for a year, our team has come to the conclusion that the best way we can reach this province is through the "Sunrise Center" community center that God has put on our hearts.



We are currently operating in a small rented space where about 30-40 kids and young people come through each week. We have English classes, speaking clubs, "life classes" – such as a class for teenagers about sex and relationships we are developing, and various activities such as game nights, open-mic nights, and cooking nights. We are already beginning to see the first-fruits of this model as teenagers coming through our center are getting plugged into youth small groups connected with the local church. We are confident that with a bigger facility and more team members we can see even more fruit like this come from this ministry.

Help us buy property and build the Sunrise Center which will become a ministry hub for all of western Mongolia parts of which are over 3,000 miles from the nearest Assemblies of God church.



BUSINESS AS MISSIONS

COUNTRY: PHILIPPINES PROJECT: IMMANUEL BIBLE COLLEGE GYM REBUILD

Started in 1957, Immanuel Bible College (IBC) is located in Cebu City, Philippines. IBC trains church planters, missionaries and pastors, and it has been one of the flagship schools for our movement for many years. The gym, which was destroyed by a typhoon, has been a great loss for the school, because the gym was operated as a Business as Misson by renting the facility to the community and others. Not only has the school lost the use of the gym for their students, they have also lost rental income the gym generated for the school. The gym brought in more than \$20,000 a year in rental income. This income is vital for the school to continue to train workers for the harvest field.





COUNTRY: PHILIPPINES PROJECT: RESTORE 500 MINISTRY

Restore 500 Ministry (R500) is a livelihood microbusiness ministry among the least reached of Southern Philippines. Through our Filipino missionaries working among the unreached tribes, R500 seeks to help 500 unreached families restore their livelihoods through training in basic business and life skills, spiritual input through the Gospel, and encouragement mentoring through our team. Families in the program receive five months of weekly training, business mentoring, and \$120 capital input to get started (further funding is possible once successful). Eighty-five families have been funded so far, and our goal is to fund another 250 families. The cost to fund a family's micro business is \$150 per year. CHURCH PLANTING & TRAINING INITIATIVE

COUNTRY: INDONESIA PROJECT: GSJA AGAPE BLESSING CHURCH IN MAKASSAR CHURCH BUILDING

The GSJA Agape Blessing Church in Makassar was started by Pastor Obet and had its first service on Easter 2012. Pastor Obet had moved from Surabaya where he had been on staff at the Ambiang Church. The first service was packed at the little hotel where the meeting was held and there was a lot of excitement to his challenging message.

The church outgrew the location within the first year and soon moved to another hotel that provided more room. The church continued to grow with a multigenerational congregation with a strong young adults group and weekly ministry was happening out of his house throughout the week, which was limited in space.

Within five years, they were given full access to a small store front that functioned as their sanctuary on the first floor, living quarters for Pastor Obet and his family on the second, and a prayer room on the third floor. It wasn't long until they started having their Sunday evening service in a hotel again as they were not able to fit everyone in the store front. The store front was used as an office as well as a preschool that was supervised by some of the members of the church. The church also has a bi-monthly ministry to the poor of Makassar, by holding a Sunday afternoon service called "House of Bread" and giving away bags of groceries. The church is feeding nearly a 100 families through this program.

Pastor Obet's church has been the most successful Assembly of God church in Makassar to date. We believe Agape Blessing Church in Makassar is and will continue to be impactful to the city of Makassar for years to come. They need a new church building to accommodate the growth.



COUNTRY: VIETNAM (HANOI) PROJECT: INTERNSHIP TRAINING HOUSE, DISCIPLESHIP AND TEAM MEETING SPACE

We have made arrangements to rent a house in Hanoi that will be used for the daily Ignite Internship teaching sessions as well as for regular team meetings for the Hanoi team including a place to study language and do small group discipleship. We need to rent a facility and provide needed renovations and furnishings for it to be used.





COUNTRY: INDONESIA PROJECT: BALI HOME CHURCH MOVEMENT

Since 2020, we have planted five churches in Bali and one on the island of Lombok. We mentor leaders to pastor these churches and continue the work. Around 50 percent of Faith Fellowship congregants come from a Balinese Hindu background and God is doing an amazing work. We want to rent a house or building to be used as a multi-purpose facility for meetings, counseling sessions, mentoring and trainings, as well as general office space.

COUNTRY: VIETNAM (HO CHI MINH CITY) PROJECT: RIVER INTERNATIONAL CHURCH RELOCATION AND RENOVATIONS

River Church is an international church in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam. Due to growth over the last few years, we are needing to move to another facility. In moving, expenses will be high as we will have to remodel a facility to fit all of the needs of the church. We will need a service area that will seat 150-200 people. River Church also has a business and a charity that operate from its facility during the week reaching families from the poorest of the poor to the middle class and wealthy. Due to these programs, offices and classes are needed as well.



CHURCH PLANTING & TRAINING INITIATIVE CONTINUED

COUNTRY: FRENCH POLYNESIA PROJECT: CONFERENCE AND TRAINING CENTER

We are partnering with the Assemblies of God of French Polynesia to develop a conference and training center. Pastor Eugene Lemarie has a vision of creating a conference center that can accommodate youth and children's camps, men's and women's retreats as well as intensive ministry training. His dream is that this campus would eventually become French Polynesia's first resident Bible School.

Under the leadership of Pastor Eugene, the Assemblies of God of French Polynesia have purchased a beautiful parcel of land for this project at the cost of \$250,000USD. They own this property debt free. The center would include dormitory housing, a chapel, kitchen and dining facilities and apartments for guest speakers.





COUNTRY: VIETNAM PROJECT: CHURCH PLANTER SUPPORT

We have been training Vietnamese evangelists and church planters in Hanoi, Dien Bien and Quang Ngai. These are two-year ministerial training programs focused on mobilizing Vietnamese men and women into the ministry. During the two years, they stay engaged in ministry in their home area and work with a seasoned church planter.

We have planted over 60 churches through our training program over the past several years. Once a church planter is launched into the villages, the cost to provide support is \$45 a month for up to two years. There are currently 42 church planters ready to launch and in need of support.

COUNTRY: VIETNAM PROJECT: IGNITE INTERNSHIP HANOI

This is a one-year program that provides practical ministry experience, discipleship, and non-formal didactic training for Vietnam University students. We need your help to provide scholarships for these students to attend this life-changing internship.



COUNTRY: PAPUA NEW GUINEA PROJECT: MINISTRY TRAINING CENTER

The Assemblies of God of Papua New Guinea has an ambitious and well developed vision to increase from a church of 200,000 to 1,000,000 adherents by 2050. The key strategic bottleneck is their current capacity for training new ministers. Currently they have five regional Bible schools. Over the next 25 years they need to increase the capacity of these schools tenfold.

They dream of starting this process by doubling the current capacity of each of the regional Bible schools by 2027. This growth in capacity can be achieved on the campuses of the existing schools. It would involve the building of dormitories, classrooms, staff housing and expanded kitchen facilities. The immediate need is for five new Bible College dormitories.



COUNTRY: CAMBODIA PROJECT: CAMBODIA TRAIN UP CHILDREN'S HOME

The Cambodia Train Up Children's Home was given a mandatory notice to vacate their property of 30 years with no place to go. The property we've occupied for 30 years was taken over by the mafia who wants to transform it into a casino. The children (orphans) and staff are in desperate need of a new home due to current unsuitable renting conditions: high monthly fees and a building in disrepair. In addition to the vision of a new children's home, this will be a community outreach learning center to further establish the Church in Cambodia. This project will consist of buying land and building children's dorms, offices, and classrooms.





COUNTRY: PHILIPPINES PROJECT: CHILDCARE COMMUNITY MINISTRIES PHILIPPINES

CCMP partners with local churches in some of the country's poorest communities, reaching out with a tangible demonstration of God's love and the gospel. CCMP provides undernourished children with the nutrition they need to grow healthy and develop fully so they can reach their God-given potential. This program reaches nearly 1,000 children and transforms communities in need.

COUNTRY: INDONESIA PROJECT: NEW BEGINNINGS SAFEHOUSE -PROJECT RESCUE

New Beginnings is a much-needed safe house and aftercare program ministering to trafficked and exploited women in Indonesia. They offer hope, transformational change, and opportunity for a new life through an empowerment program. The home offers shelter, a healing program, and a new community so victims of human trafficking can become healthy survivors in every way. New Beginnings' empowerment program provides education, counseling, medical care, and legal assistance for women and their children.



COUNTRY: PHILIPPINES PROJECT: HOPE SCHOLARS



Hope Scholars exists to be a bridge to Christ and His love in the lives of unreached people groups, and disadvantaged groups. We share His love through college scholarships, elementary tutoring, sports programs, and a preschool in a UPGs village. We use weekly small group Bible studies, mentoring, and the teaching of life skills with our college students, while helping them attend college. Three days a week we have tutoring and sports programs for elementary students at our student center and preschool education at our preschool in a Muslim village.

COUNTRY: PHILIPPINES PROJECT: HAPPY HORIZONS CHILDREN'S HOME - PROJECT RESCUE

Happy Horizons Children's Home provides a safe and protected home, a Christian education, nutrition, and a strong foundation for a brighter future for young girls rescued from human trafficing. Most of all, Happy Horizons provides a place of love and belonging, where kids find Jesus and lives are transformed.



REGIONAL CAMPUS MINISTRIES



COUNTRY: INDONESIA PROJECT: START 100 NEW CAMPUS MINISTRIES

Reach the campus, change the nation. The future leaders of the country are in the classroom now. Over the past four years we've started 60 local church-based campus ministries. We're looking to plant 100 new campus churches. The cost per campus church plant is \$1,000 for our team to travel, train, empower, and resource these young leaders. Each successful campus church plant depends on two things: in-person training and empowered leadership. The training includes a weekend retreat of vision casting, personal evangelism, small group leadership, and on campus prayer walking.



COUNTRY: JAPAN PROJECT: CHI ALPHA STUDENT CENTER IN TOKYO

The Chi Alpha Student Center in the middle of Tokyo has served as a key focal point for student ministry in Japan since 2008. However, the city is widening the road and will take part of our building so we need to find a new property and building so that student ministry can continue. Japan is less than 1% Christian and is the second largest unreached people group in the world. For decades evangelism and missions in this nation have been difficult, but we have found the most open segment of the population to be the university students. So, we believe campus ministry is one of the keys for revival in Japan.

Chi Alpha Japan, the Assemblies of God outreach to university students, has been active on 20 campuses across Japan and our focus has been evangelistic Bible Studies and also events at our Student Center.

Thousands of young people have passed through the doors of the Student Center over these past 14 years, and we have seen students saved, healed, baptized in the Holy Spirit, and called into ministry in our ministry facility. We have served thousands of meals, prayed and counseled students, held English classes, discipled and done National Training Conferences in our facility. It has also served as housing for our staff and for many teams and interns.

Because the city is widening the road outside of our building, they will take part of our Student Center. Thus, we need to locate a new property this year and renovate it so we can have a sanctuary and make it soundproof to have praise and worship in the middle of densely populated Tokyo (Japanese noise laws are very strict). We also need to have a kitchen and dining room large enough to feed students and housing for staff/teams.
