MEMORIZE IT

One of the best ways to meditate on God's Word is to memorize it. Take a verse and write it down on a card. Perhaps write it out on a note on your phone. Maybe even read it out loud on a recording to your phone and play it again and again to yourself.

Another great way to memorize it is to take one verse and emphasize a different word each time you read it.

Memorization is one of the best ways of meditation because you have to think about it repeatedly.
