


The Right Approach To The Bible

To get the most out of these series, let me encourage you to do a few things.

What I want for you is to become a lifelong learner of the Bible. A life-long student. Give you a knife and a fork so that you can feed yourself God's Word. When we are babies, we need someone to feed us, but as we grow older, we learn to feed ourselves. That is what I am going to teach you to do.

How many of you have heard the phrase – give a man a fish and you have fed him for a day. Teach a man to fish and you have fed him for a lifetime.

I remember when I first took my oldest son Braden fishing. He was five or six at the time. I taught him how to put the worm on the hook. Tie the hook on the fishing string, taught him how to cast it, watch the bobber and when that bobber started bouncing – pull up and reel it in.

It took patience to teach him to do all that, but he caught a fish after a little bit of practice.

The joy on his face when he caught his first fish on his own was priceless.



Now I could have brought him with me and caught a fish for him – he probably would have been pretty bored with that – but putting the work in, learning how to do it for himself – the personal satisfaction and joy were evident – This is the picture of joy in a boy when he catches his own fish.

That's what I want for you. That's what I wish for you for the rest of your life regarding the Bible. I want to teach you how to study the Bible and experience the blessing of doing it yourself. You know what will happen when you do – JOY.

You will know a lot about the Bible when we are done, but hopefully, you will be closer to God, stronger in the Lord, and experiencing the blessings that the Bible promises from those who love God's Word.

Spending time in the Word of God is spending time with Jesus
